Think of the people in each of our lives that need help receiving this news and who want to understand what it means for the Lord of love and life to be their savior. As we begin a new season in our life together this summer, let us be intentional about making a Holy Spirit noise. Write down one name and begin to pray that the Holy Spirit send words of life from your heart, mind and voice to that person whom God is calling.
